You Can Ride 2 - Borrow a Bike Program Frequently Asked Questions:

WHO

1. Who can access the program?

- Any child between the age of 3 and 20 who lives within 2 hours drive of Edmonton (Google maps)
- All children must have a referral from an adapted phys-ed, physio or occupational therapist. If you do
 not have a referrer, please email <u>info@youcanride2.ca</u> within 2 weeks of submitting your registration.
- ★ Parents **MUST** be able to: store the bike in a dry, secure location; arrange for pickup and return of the bicycle on the specified days*; and participate in two mandatory Fitting surveys

WHAT

1. What do I have to do to register?

★ Go to the website (<u>youcanride2.ca</u>) and search for the registration link under the Borrow a Bike program. NOTE: Registration opens on <u>January 7, 2024 at 12:00 pm.</u>

2. What kind of bikes/adaptations do you have in the program?

- We have approximately 200 adaptive bicycles in different styles and levels of support.
- We have very skilled mechanics helping therapists to fit the bikes to your child's specific needs.
- 3. What bike will we get? A bike will be assigned based on your child's needs and the time you register.

WHERE

1. Where are the Fitting days? Our location is at 11415-168 St. in the Community Engagement Centre. **HOW**

1. How does registration work?

- A. **PHASE 1:** Parents/guardians will enter their contact information, the child's name, and the child's functional abilities. Parents will also need to enter their child's therapist's (or referrer) information.
- B. **PHASE 2:** Parents/guardians will provide information on their child's functional abilities. It is **EXTREMELY** important that parents fill out the form accurately (including an accurate <u>measurement of the child's inseam</u>). Bikes are not assigned until you complete Phase 2 of the registration.
- C. **PHASES 3-4:** Once all above information is obtained, a bike will be assigned for the child.
- 2. How much does it cost to borrow a bike? The cost to families is up to \$300 for a season.
 - ★ \$100 refundable equipment deposit. This is due before you take the bike. Families experiencing financial difficulties can apply for assistance.
 - ★ \$75 seasonal rental fee. All rental fees are due before you take the bike. If you fulfill a 4-5 hour volunteer commitment, the rental fee will be refunded.
 - ★ \$25 seasonal enrolment fee + \$100 fundraising fee. This helps cover the cost of running the program (these fees are covered if qualifying for low income subsidy).

3. How can I make sure I get the best bike for my child?

★ There is no guarantee of getting the exact bike you want, but by <u>registering as early as possible and taking the time to fill out the registration completely</u> you will increase your chances dramatically. We strongly recommend putting in your registration in the first week, and ideally on January 7. Registration opens at 12:00 pm. **Attending a Try a Bike Day makes a big difference in finding that perfect bike!

WHEN

1. When do I find out if my child has been assigned a bicycle and which one it is?

• You will have a chance to see the assigned bike at Try a Bike day. Assignments are finalized after this.

2. When can I take the bike home?

• There will be two fitting events in 2024: one in March and one in April. In most cases, you bring the bike home then. No fittings will be held outside of our regularly scheduled events.

IMPORTANT NOTE: In general, children with significant mobility challenges (i.e. who use a wheelchair or mobility aide) will be fit in March and those with fewer mobility challenges will be fit in April. Please keep these dates open as requesting a different date or time will affect the bike your child is matched with.

Please note: Not following program guidelines may result in ineligibility for future borrowing.
